

PASSENGERS AND CREW / LOST AND SAVED

[Compiled by Lester J. Mitcham and first presented in Chapter 4 of *Report Into the Loss of the SS Titanic – A Centennial Reappraisal*, by Samuel Halpern et. al., The History Press, 2011.]

When *Titanic* left Queenstown, there were 1,317 passengers and 891 crew on board. The breakdown of passenger and crew numbers are shown in the following tables. Included in the passenger numbers are the 9 members of the Guarantee Group from Harland & Wolff and the 8 members of the ship's orchestra. Included in the Victualling Department crew numbers are the 2 Marconi operators, 69 restaurant staff, and the 5 mail clerks.

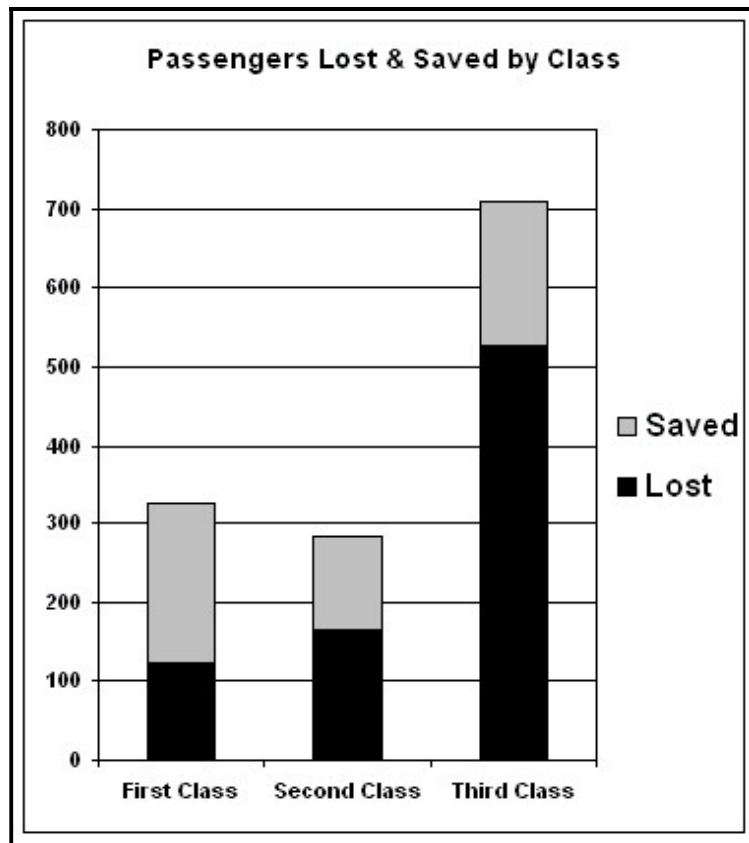


Fig. 1 – Passengers lost and saved.

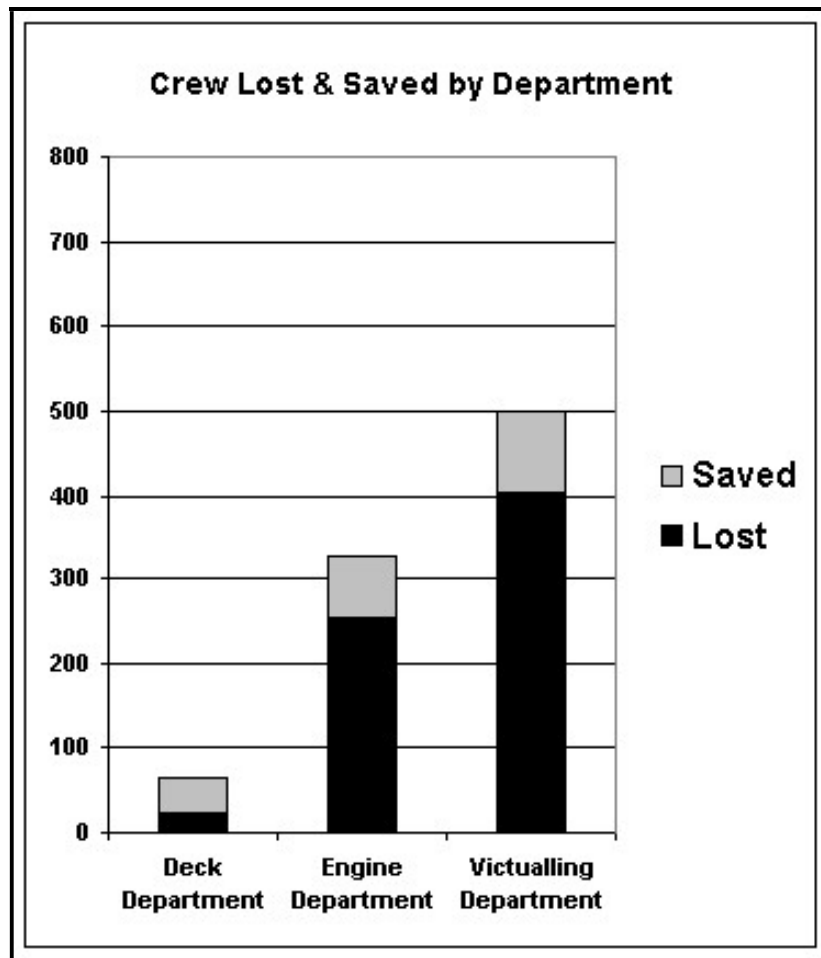


Fig. 2 – Crew lost and saved.

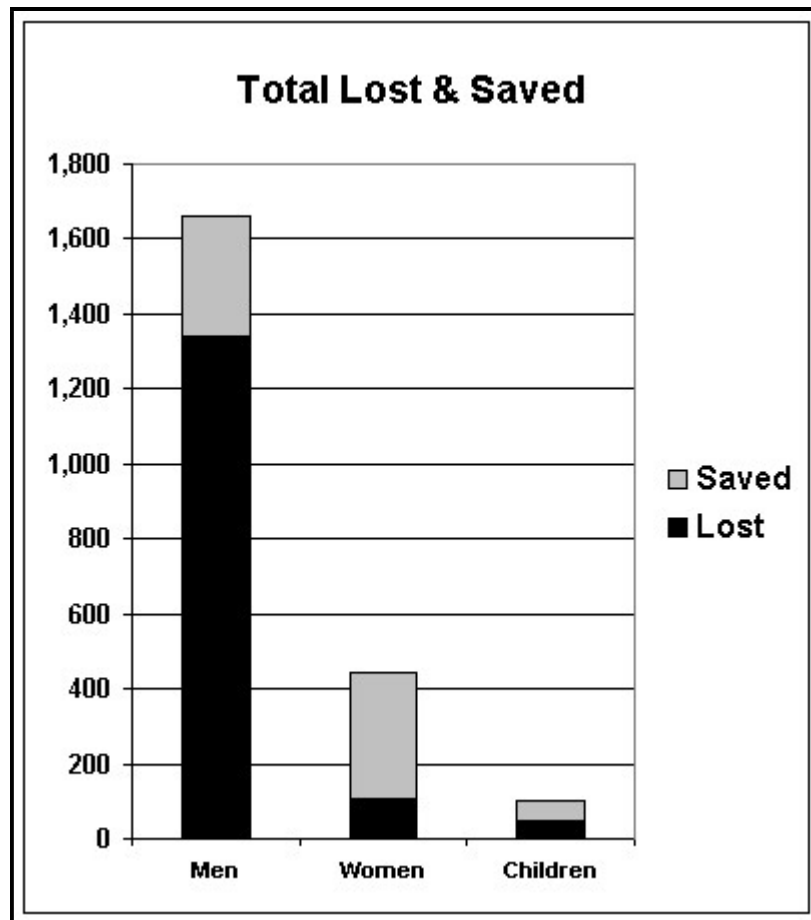


Fig. 3 – Total passengers and crew lost and saved.
